What are the Sustainable Development Goals?

The Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) give us a shared framework to deal with global issues such as poverty, social injustice, and equitable access to education, training and lifelong learning. Good quality, affordable and inclusive education and training along with opportunity for lifelong learning are powerful vehicles for economic and social wellbeing and sustainable development. Governments have the responsibility to ensure that education and training provision is gender informed, designed to empower women and girls and achieve gender equality.

In 2015, 193 countries unanimously accepted Sustainable Development **Goal 4: To bring quality, equitable, inclusive education and lifelong learning opportunities to their citizens.**

But declaring goals is just the first step in any action plan. What's needed now is good policy and funding to ensure the good outcomes are achieved in a timely way.

Towards a gender informed national plan

This forum organised by Women in Adult and Vocational Education (WAVE) and Adult Learning Australia (ALA), and supported by EU Centre at RMIT University will explore the role of the Sustainable Development Goals and their implications for Australia.
