



<u>Primary Objective:</u> Under the direction of the Higher Education Manager and whilst empowering Yolngu mentors, deliver academic language, digital literacy, and academic skills support to Yolngu students to improve their quality of life by enabling their access to Vocational and Tertiary education pathways and qualifications.

Key Accountabilities and Responsibilities:

- 1. Apply a broad range of communication styles and teaching methods to the flexible delivery of education to reduce the barriers to ongoing participation in higher education.
- 2. Develop resources to support student learning with a specific focus on academic language, digital literacy, and academic skills.
- 3. Build and maintain relationships with the Mentors, and assist them to obtain the development, equipment, and consumables required for them to guide students in a safe and supported environment.
- 4. Provide the Higher Education Manager with all required reports, timetables, and enrolment information accurately and on time.
- 5. Provide physical and administration support to the Higher Education Hub including preparation, cleaning, equipment preparation, consumables preparation, activity briefings, stock control, purchasing, logistics, rostering, maintenance, and coordination.
- 6. Work with Mentors and key stakeholders to maximise participant attendance by identifying and addressing barriers to participation.
- 7. As directed, participate in site meetings, training, and community forums.
- 8. Be a champion of the ALPA values and demonstrate a commitment to work health and safety.



To Apply You Need to Demonstrate

- 1. Recent experience in the delivery of adult education in an adult VET or Tertiary level setting.
- 2. Undergraduate level qualifications (Bachelor's) in a relevant field.
- 3. Experience managing a work environment where duties included site preparation, managing equipment, ordering stock, and developing staff skills.
- 4. Experience in adhering to and reporting on key performance indicators.
- 5. Intermediate skills in the Microsoft Office Suite.
- 6. Highly effective interpersonal skills including proficient written and oral communication skills that can be adapted to meet the needs of people from all education levels, language abilities, and ethnic origin.
